## How much time do I need to commit?

- A minimum of 2 hours

- All appropriate materials to support your role will be supplied by us including a briefing on the day.
- A member of Racing Welfare staff will be available to give you continuous support, advice and guidance throughout your role.

- Valuable experience of volunteering that you can add to your CV
- You can claim previously agreed out of pocket travel expenses
